
Who We Are

Smile for a Lifetime of Southwest Chicagoland is a charitable, non-profit organization that provides orthodontic care to individuals who may not other wise have the opportunity to acquire assistance. It is our mission to create self-confidence, inspire hope, and change the lives of children in our community in a dramatic way. The gift of a smile can do all this for a deserving, underserved individual who, in turn, can use this gift to better themselves and our community.

Dr. Barry Booth, a local orthodontist, founded the local chapter in 2011 as a way to reach those in need. Smile for a Lifetime of Southwest Chicagoland is run by a local board of directors that reviews applications and selects candidates. While Dr. Booth is the orthodontic provider for the foundation, he does not serve on the Board.

About the Doctor

Dr. Barry Booth has been a practicing orthodontic specialist in Homer Glen since 1986. He received his Doctor of Dental Surgery, Specialist Certificate and Master of Science in



Orthodontics at the University of Illinois. He currently returns to the University of Illinois as an occasional, volunteer clinical instructor in the Department of Orthodontics.

From 1988-91, Dr. Booth was part of a surgical orthodontic team with Cook County Hospital in Chicago, treating patients with accident-related injuries and birth defects as well as facial and dental deformities. Dr. Booth is a board certified, orthodontic specialist.

Dr. Booth and his wife, Jane, have three children, Ryan, Laura and Evan. Ryan, the oldest son, is currently in dental school. Dr. Booth enjoys hiking, camping, snow-boarding, marathon running and fly fishing in his free time.

Who Qualifies

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- · generally between the ages of 11 and 19
- family income of no more than 185% of poverty level.
 (In general, if the applicant qualifies for the free or reduced-price school lunch program, he or she will meet the financial qualifications of Smile for a Lifetime)
- · must have a significant aesthetic need for braces
- · must be a currently enrolled student
- · must have a positive attitude
- must agree to follow the treatment plan, and demonstrate the ability and commitment to make all appointments on time
- must be willing to complete 10 hours of community service during and after treatment

To become a candidate, interested patients must complete or have completed for them, a Smile for a Lifetime Foundation application.

This includes:

- application form and questions found on www.boothorthodontics.com.
- two letters of recommendation (Please do not submit more than two letters, and limit each reference letter to one page each. Please type or print clearly with black ink, no pencil.)
- two pictures of the applicant (one smiling facial photo and one close up in which the applicant's teeth are clearly visible)

The application, letters of reference, and pictures will not be returned and will become property of Smile for a Lifetime foundation.
